

Welcome Spring with Volunteers of America-Greater New York



As we welcome warmer weather in these next months and celebrate Earth Day in April, there are several opportunities for volunteers to participate in beautification projects such as painting and landscaping at Volunteers of America-Greater New York's (VOA-GNY) residences and shelters that provide housing for those in need.

Respect for individuals and families in our care is always our top priority, and capital improvement projects help residents feel a connection to the community and a sense of pride in where they live. Our buildings are always in need of "facelifts" for which we do not have the funding.

Sample needs right now include:

Bronx: Our supportive housing residence, which serves formerly homeless families, is looking to install a playground in their backyard for the children to enjoy after school and during the summer months.

Manhattan: Our supportive housing residence for individuals living with HIV/AIDS has a rooftop garden, and spring is an ideal time for planting fresh flowers and plants.

Brooklyn: Our East Brooklyn residence, which serves 174 individuals including veterans, individuals with a history of behavioral health issues, and formerly homeless adults, has a large backyard that is often used to celebrate holidays. The space needs to be raked and painted, and several of the hedges require trimming.

Learn More About How VOA Helps: The Facts on Teen Dating Violence

According to the National Research Center on Dating Violence, there are approximately 1.5 million high school students nationwide who experience physical abuse by a dating partner each year. While the manifestation of abuse is similar across all age groups, experiencing abuse during adolescence can shape a person's perceptions and have lasting traumatic impacts.



VOA-GNY's domestic violence programs are committed to helping survivors by providing adequate resources and safety plans.

VOA-GNY operates three domestic violence shelters and nine scattered-site safe dwellings that have interventions in place to help survivors of abuse regain safety and independence. We provide resources to those who want to seek counseling, and safety plans for those in our shelters and safe dwellings. We help them plan ways to move safely around the city and know what they can do should they run into their abuser or their abuser's family and friends. VOA-GNY also provides education on teen dating and abuse in schools throughout our community, as well as to local organizations like Boys Town.
