

# BE TAX WISE

A bequest is one of the easiest types of charitable gifts to make. It can also create tax advantages. If you give an asset like a traditional IRA (which carries a tax liability when given to an individual) to Volunteers of America, Utah, then your heirs won't owe any tax on it. Or, you could make VOAUT the beneficiary of the residual of your estate in case there's anything left over.
