Registration / Cancellations

- Advanced telephone registration is required for all sessions. NO ON-SITE registrations are accepted.

Payment

1. There is no fee for training sessions for providers that accept funding from the Child Care Assistance Program.
2. Participants employed at centers that do not receive CCAP payments must pay \$10.00 per three hours of training.
3. All providers must e-mail or mail in registration form for the registration process to be complete. When we receive your form, you will receive a confirmation notice. If your registration form is not received within 5 days, you will be dropped from the session.
